# **Haywood Community College Courses**





<u>Career and College Promise</u> Beginning in spring 2012 semester the Career and College Promise program replaced dual enrollment, huskins, and learn and earn online initiatives, as the way for high school students to earn college credit tuition free. Career and College Promise provides seamless dual enrollment educational opportunities for eligible North Carolina high school students in order to accelerate completion of college certificates, diplomas, and associate degrees that lead to college transfer or provide entry-level job skills. #### **College Transfer Pathways**

College transfer pathways provide up to 34 hours of tuition-free course credits toward the Core 44, an agreed-upon 44 hours of college credits that will transfer seamlessly to any public or participating private college or university, saving successful students time and money in pursuing four-year degrees.

To be eligible for enrollment, a high school student must meet the following criteria:

- a. Be a high school junior or senior;
- b. Have a weighted GPA of 3.0 ("B") on high school courses; and
- c. Demonstrate college readiness on an assessment or placement test
- To maintain eligibility for continued enrollment, a student must:
- a. Continue to make progress toward high school graduation, and
- b. Maintain a 2.0 in college coursework after completing two courses.

Students must enroll in one college transfer pathway and may only enroll in courses that are part of that pathway. Students may switch pathways with the principal's approval. #### **Career Technical Education Pathways**

The Career and college Promise Career Technical Education Pathway leads to a certificate or diploma aligned with a high school Career Cluster.

To be eligible for enrollment, a high school student must meet the following criteria:

- a. Be a high school junior or senior;
- b. Have a weighted GPA of 3.0 ("B") or higher on high school courses OR have the recommendation of the high school principal or his/her designee; and
- c. Meet the prerequisites for the career pathway.

## To maintain eligibility for continued enrollment, a student must:

- a. Continue to make progress toward high school graduation, and
- b. Maintain a 2.0 in college coursework after completing two courses.

Students must enroll in one career technical education pathway and may only enroll in courses that are part of that pathway. Students may switch pathways with the principal's approval.
