ALLIANCE FOR EQUALITY

Alliance for Equality is an after school club dedicated to the awareness and acceptance of social differences. The club will create a support system for students facing hardships surrounding social issues including but not limited to; sexuality, race, gender, religion, and disabilities. We will include discussions about current events, bullying, identity, diversity, equality, and acceptance.
