Please remember:

The law requires all 18-year-old men to register for selective service. You may register at your local post office or via the internet at www.sss.gov.

North Carolina Alpha Delta Kappa International Honor Society:

Pick up a fact sheet and application in the counseling center for up to 3 different scholarships. Requires an application form, transcript, two recommendations, recent picture, and personal statement.

Deadline **Feb. 2, 2010.**

State Employees Association of North Carolina:

20 awards for 4-year schools and 4 awards for 2-year schools. Applicant or parent/guardian must be a member of SE-ANC. Applications are available at www.seanc.org and must be postmarked by

April 15, 2010.

GANAS Scholarship / Loan for students who are migrants or are formerly migrants.

Application in counseling center; Deadline **April 10, 2010**

KFC Colonel's Scholars: Up to \$5000 for students with GPA of 2.75 or higher.

Janice M. Scott Memorial Scholarship Fund:

Students with 2.5 GPA or higher with community service and extracurricular involvement should complete application, request a transcript, acquire two letters of recommendation, complete a financial statement, provide a photograph, and write a reflective essay. Should be postmarked by **March 31, 2010.**

Carolina Tall Club: Application (available in counseling center), transcript, essay and two recommendations must be received by **January 25, 2010.**

Application, signed agreement, transcript, test scores, recommendation, personal statement, resume, Federal Tax Form 1040, and W-2 Forms are required. Legal Support Staff of Asheville: Application in the counseling center. Due back to our office **January 15.**

Bullard Scholarship for students interested in full time Christian ministry. Applications available in the counseling center. Must be postmarked by **January 15, 2010.**

It's already second semester of my senior year?!?

What do I do now?

First, go online to **www.fafsa.ed.gov** to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. Even if you do not qualify for federal or state grants, most colleges still consider the EFC (Expected Family Contribution) generated by this report when they determine need-based grants, loans, or work study positions. Do this as soon as possible since most schools treat need-based financial aid on a first-come, first-served basis.

Remember your pin number, save a copy of the completed documents (to make the process easier next year), and have your family's financial documents nearby for your reference. It is much easier to complete this form if your family's tax forms are already completed.

If you have questions, do not hesitate to call a college financial aid office for assistance. They really don't mind!



Next, continue listening to announcements, checking our bulletin board, and visiting the counseling center for scholarship opportunities as they arise.

Finally, your applications should all be in, but there is still time to make some college visits before any final decisions. Check the schools' websites for open houses and special events.
