You may buy or borrow your books (traditional or e-books). Blue Ridge Books on Main Street has a summer reading display and may give you a discount if you mention that you are a Tuscola student. This assignment and all links are on our class website (above).

Please read two books this summer; one is assigned, and one is your choice.

Novel: The Book Thief by Markus Zusak

Narrated by Death, this Holocaust novel is lengthy but fascinating!

- 1. Read the entire novel and be prepared to say something intelligent about the book that goes beyond just the plot. Think about connections to your life, prior Holocaust/history knowledge, etc.
- 2. Create <u>one good discussion question and two different answers</u> to that one question about the novel. Remember that good discussion questions show higher-level thinking and do not have simple answers that all readers agree with, allowing you to compose two different answers.
 - ♦ To help you, good examples from *Romeo and Juliet* are:
 - What is the biggest obstacle between Juliet and Romeo? Explain.
 - o Is it better to read the play in Shakespearean English or in modern translation? Why?
 - These are two examples to help you, but remember to write one question with two different answers.
 - Suggested length: one question plus two paragraphs (one for each answer)
- 3. Be ready for a test the first week of school.

Nonfiction Work: your choice

- 1. Choose a nonfiction work of at least 100 pages. It can be on any topic you like!
- 2. <u>Before purchasing or reading your book</u>, you must get it approved by emailing me no later than June 30. Your email will be your first minor class grade. In your email, please include:
 - ♦ Your name
 - ♦ Book title
 - ♦ Author
 - ♦ Why this book appeals to you
 - ♦ Something interesting you'd like me to know about you

I will respond within one week. If you need help choosing a work, the American Library Association has a nicely annotated list, but *please do not feel confined to this list!*
