WAYS IN WHICH CONTENT AND INSTRUCTION ARE MODIFIED FOR HIGH ACHIEVING AND GIFTED STUDENTS:

- 1. Students will be required to do a great deal of outside reading and studying. Some reading assignments will be on the college level and each reading assignment may be covered on any quiz or test, whether or not the material was covered in class. Tests will include an essay component.
- 2. Students will be required to demonstrate independent note-taking ability.
- 3. Students will be required to weigh evidence in accepting or rejecting historical interpretations.
- 4. Students will be required to analyze and assess historical materials including their reliability and relevance to a problem.
- 5. Students should be familiar with the various types of material used in historical studies and how to use each one (i.e. surveys, primary sources, interpretative works, etc.)
- 6. Students will be required to complete a 7-10 page research paper, focusing on using primary sources, on specific topics relating to the time period.
