school chapter in secondary public and accredited private schools by a 5 member Faculty Council. NHS membership is open to juniors and seniors with a 3.75 cumulative GPA and is by invitation only. They meet on the last Thursday of the month. The application process begins in August and new member induction is in October. All members independently complete school and community service activities, and this school year, hope to have at least one major community service project involving the club as a whole. CALLENT Career and Technical Honor Society is a recognition program for high school students who show achievement in Career and Technical Education courses. Membership criteria include: Enrollment in a completer course (seniors) and cumulative GPA or 3.25 or better. Career and Technical class average 93 or better for Fall Semester in their Senior Year, and no detention that school year. The Career and Tech Senior teacher will recommend and approve during the senior year with Spring notification. Certificate and recognition of members will take place during the annual Academic Awards Ceremony. CTHS is sponsored by Sandra Garland and Tracy Rich.

Tobacco Reality Unfiltered is sponsored by the NC Health and Wellness Trust Fund in conjunction with the Haywood County Health Department. No membership fee is required. The NCHWTF takes care of expenses. Meetings are Monday every other week right after school. Their main goal is to encourage others, especially kids and teens, to consider the dangers of tobacco use and ultimately not use tobacco products at all. A major part of the club's responsibility lies in teaching tobacco prevention classes to all the fifth grade classes in the county. Dawn Jones sponsors the TRU Club.

RRENCH SLOPE THS French Club is open to anyone with an interest in French language and/or cultures of French-speaking countries. Enrollment in a French class is recommended but not required. Meeting times will be decided at the beginning of the new school year based on the consensus of club members, but historically have taken place approximately once per month in the mornings before school. Activities include French songs and games, field trips to Paris Bakery in Asheville, lunch meetings to celebrate such events as Mardi Gras, participation in foreign language events at WCU, and French movie nights. Service projects include participation in the Haywood County Arts Council craft table at the Folkmoot International Festival. The THS French Club is not affiliated with any national organization. Mrs. Marth is club sponsor.

Spanned Club membership is open to students enrolled in a Spanish class and ESL students. Election of officers takes place at the first meeting of the year, in September. Meetings are before school, approximately once a month, and dues are \$5.00 for the year. The club plans varying activities throughout the year including Spanish food luncheons, tutoring Hispanic students on and off campus, sponsoring needy families at Christmas, helping elementary and middle school ESL students, movie nights, eating out at restaurants, and other special projects. First Carolina Envirothon is a natural resource education program for both high school and middle school students. It is an outside oriented program in which students work together in teams of five, learn to use critical thinking skills, work in teams, develop problem solving solutions to enhance communication and increase observation skills to answer written questions or conduct hands-on investigations about our natural resources and environmental issues. The program focuses on five areas of study: aquatic resources, forest resources, soils/land use, wildlife resources and current environmental issues. Students meet monthly for field trips and activities. Any student interested in forestry, aquatics, soils, wildlife or environmental issues is eligible to participate. Mr. Ethridge and Mrs. Miller coordinate the Envirothon teams.

Sponsors the **Ecology Club**. Students in the Ecology Club will gain insight into our natural world through outdoor activities, community service and ecology projects. Students will gain an appreciation of nature and our impact on the natural world. Activities include hiking, camping, field trips, river and roadside cleanup, recycling, greening of our school, community awareness, data collection and more. Students meet once a month and as needed for planning of activities. Junior or Seniors enrolled in an advanced science class and in good standing at school (academics and discipline) are eligible to participate.

(Students Will Achieve Together; Together Everyone Achieves More) would like to invite you to be involved! The SWAT TEAM is a service club that works to help students and the community. Membership is open to anyone willing to help others and have a positive outlook in life. Meetings are held on Wednesday during lunch with free pizza for lunch once a month. There are no fees and members receive a free t-shirt. Activities include co-sponsoring the annual canned food drive for Haywood Christian Ministries, raising money for Christmas gifts for students that need extra help, and the Relay for Life. The SWAT TEAM raises money once a year through our annual pie fest in which we pie cheerleaders and football players. QUE The **Quiz Bowl** team participates in and organizes a variety of competitive events. Students answer questions on general knowledge, science, pop culture, literature, history, North Carolina and more. The formats include team answers and individual answers. Students meet on a regular basis and practice competition. Any student interested in competition and able to make practices is eligible to participate. Doug Hanson sponsors the Quiz Bowl.

investigates mathematical topics that strengthen those learned in regular classes through hands on activities

such as counting M&M's, building and flying paper airplanes, making mousetrap cars, holding friendly guiz bowl type competitions. To be eligible, students must be interested in math, logic, statistics, or problem solving. Dues are \$5.00 per year and members are expected to attend monthly meetings. Students eligible for Mu Alpha Theta Honor Society must have completed their 5th semester of college/university prep course with a combined non-weighted average of 3.0 and attend meetings regularly. Students wanting to participate on a Math Team must be willing to meet weekly for practices. Students are encouraged, but not required, to be a Math Club member. We participate in math competitions in and around the state. Eligible math teams are: Furman Math Meet, Log 1 Math Contest, AMC 10/12 Competition, and the WCU State Math Competition. They complete an annual Community Service Project and top off the year with an Awards Picnic and Wiffle Ball game. Jonathan Allen is the club sponsor.

WEAK Become involved in the political process and offer support for candidates of the Democratic Party at the local, state, and national levels. Membership is open to all Tuscola students with a \$5 membership fee. Meetings are generally held before school and are announced well in advance. Activities include informational meetings to educate members about various political issues and the candidates' positions. Students may represent the Democratic Part at various community activities or work at precinct offices, aiding political candidates in the election process, and assist with mock voting for elementary students. Teen Democrats encourages students to engage themselves in the political process. Dr. Larry P. Fox is the sponsor.
