Mark Your Calendars

Take the PSAT.

 The PSAT is offered at Tuscola on October 13th. The PSAT is required for several national scholarships and is especially important for National Merit Scholarships. Sign up in the Counseling Center. The cost of the test is \$13.

Start your college search.

- Make lists of your abilities, preferences, and personal qualities. List things you may want to study and do in college. Attend Haywood Community College's College Night on September 20th at 6 P.M.
- Attend College Planning Night at Tuscola on Tuesday, November 30th at 6 P.M.
- A representative from Catawba College will be in the Counseling Center on September 8th.
- Treat your school selection process like a research paper. Make a file and gather information about schools, financial aid, and campus life.
- Do your top college choices require essays or recommendations? Now is the time to begin planning your essays and choosing whom you'd like to ask for recommendations.

Start thinking about financial aid.

 Continue saving for college and researching financial aid opportunities. Haywood Community College will be holding a Financial Aid night sometime in November.

Plan your spring testing schedule.

- Tuscola is giving the ASVAB to all juniors on September 29th. (This is a free career assessment that will help clarify options after high school.)
- The SAT is offered at Tuscola on October 9th, November 6th, and June 4th.
- The SAT is offered at Pisgah on May 7th.
- The ACT is offered at Tuscola on February 12th.

ASVAB

No matter what a student is planning to do after high school, the ASVAB test is a great opportunity! The US Military does administer the exam; however, there are no obligations to talk with military recruiters or join the military. This is a WONDERFUL career assessment for students who are unsure of what careers they may be interest in.

ATTENTION JUNIORS!

If you would like to be considered for <u>National Merit Scholarships</u>, you MUST take the PSAT on Wednesday, October 13th, 2010.

You can register for the PSAT through the Counseling Center with Diana Chambers. The cost is \$13, and checks must be payable to Tuscola High School. You must sign up before Friday, October 1st.

When Do We Take the SAT?

- We recommend that students take the SAT during their junior year.
- The SAT combines the best overall score; therefore it is to the student's advantage to take the SAT more than once.
- The SAT is offered at PHS on May 7th and at Tuscola on Oct. 9th, Nov. 6th, and June 4th.
- By waiting until later in the junior year, students have the opportunity to learn more English and Math skills which will benefit them on the test. However, juniors are eligible to take the SAT at any time during their junior year.
- To register for the SAT, visit www.collegeboard.com. Our school code is 344-214. You must list our school code in order for us to get your scores.
- Students that need to receive accommodations on the SAT need to stop by the Counseling Center.
