Mark Your Calendars

Take the PSAT.

 The PSAT is offered at Tuscola on October 17th. The PSAT is required for several national scholarships and is especially important for National Merit Scholarships. Sign up in the Counseling Center with Mrs. Chambers.

Start your college search.

- Make lists of your abilities, preferences, and personal qualities. List things you may want to study and do in college.
- Attend Haywood Community College's College Night on September 10th at 6 P.M.
- A representative from Radford University will be in the Counseling Center on 9/14 @ 9am.
- Treat your school selection process like a research paper. Make a file and gather information about schools, financial aid, and campus life.
- Do your top college choices require essays or recommendations? Now is the time to begin
 planning your essays and choosing whom you'd like to ask for recommendations.

Start thinking about financial aid.

 Continue saving for college and researching financial aid opportunities. Haywood Community College will be holding a Financial Aid night in November.

Plan your spring testing schedule.

- Tuscola is giving the ASVAB to all juniors on September 19th. (This is a free career assessment that will help clarify options after high school.)
- The SAT is offered at Tuscola on October 6th, November 3rd, and June 1st.
- The SAT is offered at Pisgah on May 4th.
- The ACT is offered to all Juniors in March 2013.

All Juniors will be taking the ASVAB on September 19th at 8am in cafeteria!




ATTENTION JUNIORS!

If you would like to be considered for <u>National Merit Scholarships</u>, you MUST take the PSAT on Wednesday, October 17th, 2012.

You can register for the PSAT through the Counseling Center with Mrs. Chambers.

The cost is \$14, and checks must be payable to Tuscola High School. You must sign up before October 1st.

When Do We Take the SAT?



- The SAT combines the best overall score; therefore it is to the student's advantage to take the SAT more than once.
- The SAT is offered at PHS on May 4th and at Tuscola on Oct. 6th, Nov. 3rd, and June 1st.
- By waiting until later in the junior year, students have the opportunity to learn more English and Math skills which will benefit them on the test. However, juniors are eligible to take the SAT at any time during their junior year.
- To register for the SAT, visit www.collegeboard.com. Our school code is 344-214. You must list our school code in order for us to get your scores.

SAT Test Prep at UNC Asheville

This test preparation program concentrates on test-taking techniques, timesaving methods, logical reasoning, verbal ability and mathematical competence. Past exams and simulated materials are used to teach question types and strategies. Visit *unca.edu/testprep* to learn more about upcoming sessions.
