Course Goals: Describe Elements of Art and Subject Matter

Course Description: The course is intended to **INTRODUCE** the units: drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture and art history. The course consists of 75% studio work & 25% (art history, art criticism and art aesthetics). History curriculum will cover Western Art from Prehistoric–15,000BC to Realism – 1850’s. **Course**

Materials: *Required Fee: \$10.00 Supplies, a **Mixed Media sketchbook** at least 8.5x11 in size and a **two pocket folder**.* There is a textbook for this course; however, it stays in the classroom. There will also be readings from articles, and handouts used to further understanding. **Students must bring their own drawing pencils, eraser & pencil sharpener to class. Other personal supplies that are NOT required but suggested since there are class sets: colored pencils, pens, markers, scissors & glue sticks.**

Course Objectives: Students will:

- learn the vocabulary of the visual arts by studying the elements and principles of art and design.
- use several different visual art media and be able to execute successful works of art in each media.
- participate in art critiques and be able to discuss their opinions on or about a certain piece of work.
- **attend the THS Art Show on _____.** Students will be required to be available by their artwork to talk with guests for 1 hour. Students will receive a Test Grade and for students that do not attend will receive a grade of 49%.
- share their artwork with the community and/or the **H.C.A. Council.**
- fill out rubrics on completed art to be graded and they can resubmit for grade changes.

Expected Behavior/Outcomes:

- Come to class on time with necessary materials and be prepared to work the full period.
- Use your portfolio to store and protect your artwork.
- Actively participate in both studio time and during class critiques.
- _____ Be responsible for supplies & studio space/cubby. Clean up at least 5 minutes end of class.
- _____ Once a week students will clean up space/desk/room for a Cubby Check grade.
- _____ Students will communicate with family via an email once a week for “Fun Friday.”

Grading: Final exam for class will count for 25 percent of course semester average. The final exam will be 2 parts: The UFO Project and the Art History of the Day Book (information will be handed out). The exam will take place the last week before testing _____.

- Artwork, Critiques and Quizzes will count for 50 percent of grade.
- Classwork will count for 30 percent of grade.
- Homework will count for 20 percent of grade.

Late Work Policy: All work must be turned in on time for credit. THERE WILL BE NO LATE WORK ACCEPTED. Excused absences will not count towards the student and 2 days for each absence will be applied. Students will be given 1 "Oops I Forgot Pass" that can be used on a classroom assignment or homework assignment only and NOT a piece of Artwork.

Grading Scale-taken from Student Handbook:

A = 90-100 B = 80-89 C = 70-79 D = 60-69 F = 0-59

Consequences: On the occasion that a student is misbehaving a student will first be given a warning (a verbal warning to remind the student of the appropriate procedure). If the misbehavior continues then a conference will be held (hold students after class to discuss behavior). The last step before an office referral will be a phone call home to parents.

Attendance: Attendance will be taken during each class period. Success in this class is directly related to the student's attendance and participation in the course. Students are encouraged to the bathroom at the beginning of class and should only leave for an emergency or office/counselor appointment. When a student misses 7,8,9 those days will need to be made up following the school attendance makeup policy.

Seating Chart: All students are expected to come to class on time and to sit in their assigned seat. Failure to do so may result in the student receiving a tardy or an unexcused absence for the class.

Technology: Students will NOT be allowed to use their cell phones, headphones and other listening devices in the classroom. If students need images on their phones for projects they will need to share them in their Google Drive for class use. We are getting back to the basics in the Art Room this year and going on off the grid! Students will be allowed to listen to the music playlist that will be playing on the speakers in the classroom. Students will be given a warning and the student will then have to put their phone or listening devices in their bookbag for the remainder of the class period.
