Course Goals: Interpret Meaning and Content

Course Description: Prerequisite: Completion of Art 1 and 2, grades of A/B in both

The course is an advanced course and involves more in-depth knowledge of art processes, techniques, art media, history and evaluation. Art 3 is for students interested in pursuing a career in art related fields. The course emphasizes problem solving, portfolio development and strengthens the students' knowledge of art history, vocabulary and ability to create art. The course is intended on focusing on *MEDIA* within the units: drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture and art history. The course consists of 75% studio work & 25% (art history, art criticism and art aesthetics). History curriculum will cover Renaissance-1400's and Impressionism/Post Impressionism Works-1850's.

Course Materials: Required Fee: \$10.00 Supplies, a <u>Mixed Media sketchbook</u> at least 8.5x11 in size and a <u>two pocket folder</u>. There is a textbook for this course; however, it stays in the classroom. There will also be readings from articles and handouts used to further student understanding. **Students must** bring their own <u>drawing pencils</u>, eraser, pencil sharpener, blending stump and personal art supplies to class. Students are encouraged to create and maintain a digital portfolio/Art Instagram.

Course Objectives: Students will:

0	use vocabulary of visual art- elements & principles of art & design.	
0	be able to execute successful works of art in each media.	
0	participate in art critiques and be able to discuss their opinions.	
0	attend the THS Art Show on Students will receive a Test Grade

0	share their artwork with the community and/or the H.C.A. Council.	
0	enter art contests for WCU and Scholastic if possible.	
0	fill out rubrics on completed art to be graded and can resubmit for grade changes.

0	Once a week students will clean up space/desk/room for a Cubby Check grade.

Grading: Final exam for class will count for 25 percent of course semester average. The final exam will be 2 parts: The UFO Project and the Art History of the Day Book (information will be handed out). The exam will take place the last week before testing ______.

- -Artwork, Critiques and Quizzes will count for 50 percent of grade.
- -Classwork will count for 30 percent of grade.
- -Homework will count for 20 percent of grade.

Late Work Policy: All work must be turned in on time for credit. THERE WILL BE NO LATE WORK ACCEPTED. Excused absences will not count towards the student and 2 days for each absence will be applied. Students will be given 1 "Oops I Forgot Pass" that can be used on a classroom assignment or homework assignment only and NOT a piece of Artwork.

Grading Scale-taken from Student Handbook:

A = 90-100 B = 80-89 C = 70-79 D = 60-69 F = 0-59

Consequences: In the occasion that a student is misbehaving a student will first be given a warning (a verbal warning to remind the student of the appropriate procedure). If the misbehavior continues then a conference will be held (hold student after class to discuss behavior). The last step before an office referral will be a phone call home to parents.

Attendance: Attendance will be taken during each class period. Success in this class is directly related to the student's attendance and participation in the course. Students are encouraged to the bathroom at the beginning of class and should only leave for an emergency or office/counselor appointment. When a student misses 7,8,9 those days will need to be made up following the school attendance makeup policy.

Seating Chart: All students are expected to come to class on time and to sit in their assigned seat. Failure to do so may result in the student receiving a tardy or an unexcused absence for the class.

Technology: Students will NOT be allowed to use their cell phones, headphones and other listening devices in the classroom. If students need images on their phones for projects they will need to share them in their Google Drive for class use. We are getting back to the basics in the Art Room this year and going on off the grid! Students will be allowed to listen to the music playlist that will be playing on the speakers in the classroom. Students will be given a warning and the student will then have to put their phone or listening devices in their bookbag for the remainder of the class period.
