Course Goals: Interpret Meaning and Content

Course Description: Prerequisite: Completion of Art 1 and 2, grades of A/B in both

The course is an advanced course and involves more in-depth knowledge of art processes, techniques, art media, history and evaluation. Art 3 is for students interested in pursuing a career in art related fields. The course emphasizes problem solving, portfolio development and strengthens the students' knowledge of art history, vocabulary and ability to create art. The course is intended on focusing on *MEDIA* within the units: drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture and art history. The course consists of 75% studio work & 25% (art history, art criticism and art aesthetics). History curriculum will cover Renaissance-1400's and Impressionism/Post Impressionism Works-1850's.

Course Materials: Required Fee: \$10.00 Course Fee, a 3 ring binder(at least 1/2 inch) and a set of dividers. There is a textbook for this course; however, it stays in the classroom. There will also be readings from articles and handouts used to further student understanding. Students must bring their own drawing pencils, eraser, pencil sharpener, blending stump and personal art supplies to class. Students are encouraged to create and maintain a digital portfolio/Art Instagram.

•	Students will communicate with family via an email once a week for "Fun Friday."		
•	Students will read a book of their choice for Fun Friday 2.0 and will be

•	Students will be highly encouraged to create an Instagram for their artwork and keep it		
u	odated at least weekly. This is with permission of Parents/Guardians and not required.

-Artwork, Critiques and Quizzes will count for 50 percent of grade.

-Classwork will count for 30 percent of grade. and Homework will count for 20 percent of grade.

Late Work Policy: All work must be turned in on time for credit. THERE WILL BE NO LATE WORK ACCEPTED. Excused absences will not count towards the student and 2 days for each absence will be applied. Students will be given 1 "Oops I Forgot Pass" that can be used on a classroom assignment or homework assignment only.

Consequences: In the occasion that a student is misbehaving a student will first be given a warning (a verbal warning to remind the student of the appropriate procedure). If the misbehavior continues then a conference will be held (hold student after class to discuss behavior). The last step will be a phone call home to parents.

Attendance: Success in this class is directly related to the student's attendance and participation in the course. Students are encouraged to the bathroom at the beginning of class and should only leave for an emergency or office/counselor appointment. When a student misses 7,8,9 those days will need to be made up following the school attendance makeup policy.

Seating Chart: All students are expected to come to class on time and to sit in their assigned seat.

<u>Technology:</u> Students will be allowed to use their cell phones, headphones in the classroom while working independently on their artwork. If students need images on their phones for projects they will need to communicate that with me. We are getting back to the basics in the Art Room this year and going on off the grid! Students will be given a warning and the student will then have to put their phone in their bookbag for the remainder of the class period.

<u>Policies:</u> All Policies listed in the student handbook will be followed for every art student including: Tardies, Dress Code, Attendance and Discipline.
