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Course Goals: Evaluate Skill and Technique

Course Description: *Prerequisite: Completion of Art 3 with grades of A/B.* The course is designed for students who are pursuing a career in art as a **CRAFT/FINE ARTIST**. The course is a mirror image of Art 3, except students are required to problem solve, produce works of art and demonstrate a greater mastery of skills. Students will be required to work towards a themed portfolio of their work and a senior exhibition. The course included the units: design, drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture and art history. The course consists of 75% studio & 25% (art history, art criticism and art aesthetics). History curriculum will focus Contemporary-1950's to Present Works.

Course Materials: *Required Fee: \$10.00 Course Fee, a 3 ring binder(at least 1/2 inch) and a set of dividers.* There is a textbook for this course; however, it stays in the classroom. There will also be readings from articles and handouts to further student understanding. **Students must bring their own drawing pencils, eraser, pencil sharpener, blending stump and personal art supplies to class.** **Course Objectives: Student will:**

- use the vocabulary of visual art- elements & principles of art & design.
- be able to execute successful works of art in each media.
- learn how to participate in art critiques and be able to discuss their opinions.
- **attend the THS Art Show on _____.** Students will be required to be available by their artwork to talk with guests for 1 hour. Students will receive a Test Grade for attending. Students that do not attend will receive a grade of 49%.
- share their artwork with the community and/or the **H.C.A. Council**.
- enter art contests for WCU and Scholastic if possible.

Expected Behavior/Outcomes:

- Come to class on time with necessary materials and be prepared to work the full period.
- Use your cubby to store and protect your artwork.
- Actively participate in both studio time and during class critiques.
- _____ Be responsible for supplies & studio space/cubby. Clean up at least 5 minutes @end of class.
- _____ Once a week students will clean up space/desk/room for a Cubby Check grade.
- _____ Students will communicate with family via an email once a week for "Fun Friday."
- _____ Students will read a book of their choice or given 1 in the classroom for Fun Friday 2.0 and students will be illustrating/doodling while reading. Participation Grades will be given.
- _____ Students will be highly encouraged to create an Instagram for their artwork and keep it updated at least weekly. This is with permission of Parents/Guardians and not required.

Grading: *Final exam for class will count for 25 percent of course semester average. The final exam will be 2 parts: The UFO Project and the Art History of the Day Book (information will be handed out). The exam will take place the last week before testing _____.*

-Artwork, Critiques and Quizzes will count for 50 percent of grade.

-Classwork will count for 30 percent of grade and Homework will count for 20 percent of grade.

Late Work Policy: All work must be turned in on time for credit. THERE WILL BE NO LATE WORK ACCEPTED. Excused absences will not count towards the student and 2 days for each absence will be applied. Students will be given 1 “Oops I Forgot Pass” that can be used on a classroom assignment or homework assignment only.

Consequences: In the occasion that a student is misbehaving a student will first be given a warning (a verbal warning to remind the student of the appropriate procedure). If the misbehavior continues then a conference will be held (hold student after class to discuss behavior). The last step before an office referral will be a phone call home to parents.

Attendance: Attendance will be taken during each class period. Success in this class is directly related to the student’s attendance and participation in the course. When a student misses 7,8,9 those days will need to be made up following the school attendance makeup policy.

Seating Chart: All students are expected to come to class on time and to sit in their assigned seat.

Technology: Students will be allowed to use their cell phones, headphones in the classroom while working independently on their artwork. If students need images on their phones for projects they will need to communicate that with me. We are getting back to the basics in the Art Room this year and going on off the grid! Students will be given a warning and the student will then have to put their phone in their bookbag for the remainder of the class period.

Policies: All Policies listed in the student handbook will be followed for every art student including: Tardies, Dress Code, Attendance and Discipline.
