Educators


- Test students' ability to apply knowledge/experience to workplace situations

Assessments





Reading for Information

- Measures a person's skill in reading and using work-related information including:
 - Instructions
 - Policies
 - Memos
 - Bulletins
 - Manuals
 - Governmental Regulations

Applied Mathematics

- Measures a person's skill in using mathematical reasoning to solve work-related problems:
 - Calculating percentages, discounts and mark-ups
 - Performing multiple mathematical operations
 - Calculate perimeters and areas of basic shapes

Locating Information

- Measures a person's skill in using workplace graphics such as:
 - Diagrams
 - Floor plans
 - Tables
 - Charts
 - Graphs
 - Forms


Earning The Certificate
