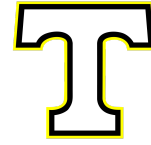


**Español 3 Honores con la Sra. Albano**

**MATERIALS:** We will use Google Classroom and online language learning sites like conjuguemos.com. Pencils, highlighters, a charged Chromebook and a notebook.

Be in class every day! It is difficult to learn a new language if you are not in class.

**Attendance will be taken at the beginning of class.** If you arrive late, you **MUST** get a tardy pass in the ISS room before coming to class. If you miss more than 6 days, you must complete attendance recovery to pass the class.

SmartPass must be used to leave class for any reason. For Bathroom: Only 1 person may be out at a time, so if a computer is already on the front desk, you must wait to request a bathroom pass from SmartPass.

**Course Description:** This course will address the three modes of communication: interpretive, interpersonal and presentational. Through these modes students will be able to:

- Demonstrate understanding in spoken and written communication within appropriate cultural contexts. At the Spanish III Honors level students will look to move beyond comprehension and begin to interpret in the target language.
- Engage in direct oral/and or written communication with others.
- Present orally and/or in writing information, concepts, and ideas to an audience of listeners or readers with no immediate interaction.

**Students will be able to:**

- Engage in original and spontaneous oral and written communications
- Demonstrate skills necessary to initiate, sustain, and close oral and written exchanges in Spanish that reflect past, present and future time.

- Comprehend the spoken and written Spanish language based on new topics in familiar as well as unfamiliar contexts that are presented through a variety of media.
- Produce and present well-organized spoken and written presentations as well as culturally authentic stories, poems, and skits in Spanish.
- Reinforce and broaden their knowledge of connections between the Spanish language and culture, and other subject areas including language arts, science, history, social science, mathematics, physical education, health and/or the arts.
- Discuss in Spanish why similarities and differences exist within the Hispanic culture and among other cultures.

### **Assessment Methods:**

- **Regular Quizzes:** Grammar and vocabulary checks
- **Oral Presentations:** Individual and group presentations on cultural topics
- **Written Emails:** Compose well written and organized emails on various themes
- **Authentic Material Assessments:** Analyzing news articles, interviews, or literary texts
- **In-Class Debates and Discussions:** Engaging in thoughtful conversations on cultural and social issues

### **Make-up Work:**

- All assigned work must be turned in on the due date. 24 hours will be given to complete all assignments. No late work accepted after we review correct answers in class.
- It is your responsibility to find out what work you missed. Check Google Classroom for assignments if you are not in class.
- QUIZZES/TESTS – You will make these up during class the day you return to school. If you are present for a quiz/test which was previously announced on a day you were present, you must take it.
