

# Teacher Cadet 2 Syllabus

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## Course Description

Teacher Cadet 2 is an advanced, application-based course designed for students who have successfully completed Teacher Cadet 1 and are seriously considering a career in education. This course places a strong emphasis on an in-depth internship experience, allowing students to actively participate in real classroom settings at the elementary, middle, or high school level.

Students will refine instructional skills, apply educational theory to practice, and develop professional dispositions necessary for effective teaching. Through extended field experiences, reflective practice, and leadership opportunities, students will gain a realistic and meaningful understanding of the teaching profession.

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## Course Objectives

By the end of this course, students will be able to:

- Apply effective instructional strategies in real classroom settings.
- Plan, deliver, and reflect on lessons aligned with curriculum standards.
- Demonstrate professional behavior and ethical responsibilities of educators.
- Analyze classroom management techniques and student engagement strategies.
- Build positive relationships with students, mentor teachers, and school staff.
- Reflect critically on teaching practices to support continuous growth.
- Explore career pathways, licensure requirements, and postsecondary options in education.

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### **Field Experience / Internship Requirements**

Students will participate in an extended internship placement at a local elementary, middle, or high school. Internships may occur multiple days per week and will increase in responsibility over time.

Internship expectations include:

- Arriving on time and following the assigned school schedule
- Maintaining professional dress and conduct
- Assisting the mentor teacher with instructional and non-instructional duties
- Teaching lessons or lesson segments as assigned
- Completing required reflections and documentation

All students must adhere to district and school policies during their internship.

- Notebook or digital device for reflections and lesson planning

- Professional attire for internship days

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## **Expectations and Policies**

**Attendance and Participation:** Attendance is critical due to the internship component. Students are expected to be present, punctual, and actively engaged both on campus and at internship sites.

**Professionalism:** Students are expected to demonstrate maturity, respect, confidentiality, and ethical behavior at all times.

**Assignments:** All assignments must be completed on time. Late work may receive a grade deduction unless prior arrangements are made.

**Internship Conduct:** Failure to follow school or district policies may result in removal from the internship and impact course credit.

- **Reflective Journal:** Ongoing reflections connecting classroom experiences to educational theory.
- **Career and College Exploration Project:** Research and presentation on education career pathways and preparation programs.
- **Final Reflection Project:** A culminating reflection analyzing personal growth and readiness for a future in education.
