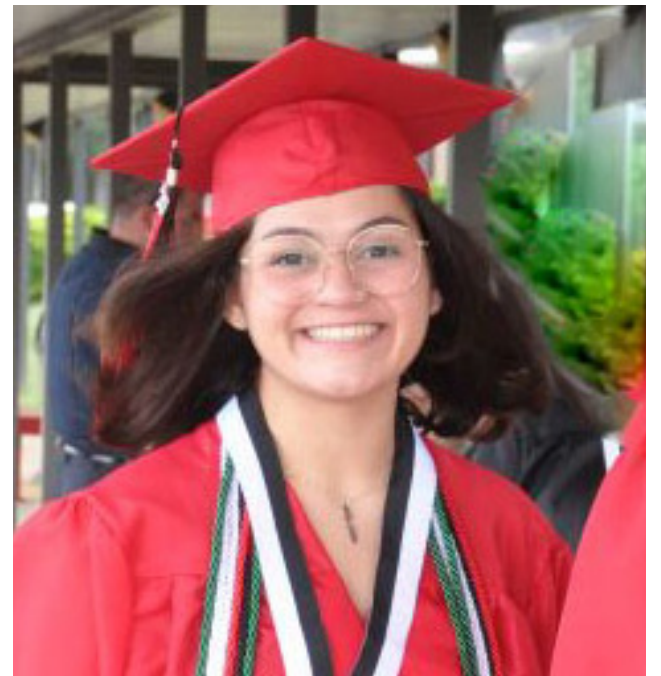

Welcome to Haywood County Schools for the 2020-21 school year. COVID-19 and significant national civil unrest have created volatile and unpredictable times. Society is divided on many fronts. As we move into the school year, I am certain about two things: we need your support more than ever, and no one really knows what will happen in the coming weeks and months.

Haywood County Schools is committed to providing both in-person and remote learning this year, so students and parents can make a personal choice that best meets their family needs. Please help us by taking some time during the first couple weeks of school to determine the best choice for your family.

Here is some initial information to get started on your personal learning choice. Our school system selected Plan B, Option F of the state's authorized reopening options for schools. Orientation for teachers and other ten-month school staff began on August 11. School officially began on August 17 with remote and some small group in-person orientational learning for students and parents. When orientation is completed, we will transition into a period of intensive remote learning including daily check-ins between teachers and students. Simultaneously, we will provide on campus in-person learning for some at-risk students. This work will be evaluated to determine when we can provide in-person learning for families who choose the in-person option. Our goal for starting broad-based in-person learning is September 21.

I would like to encourage every to intentionally foster more unity and less divisiveness on a personal and community level. When there are disagreements, some people choose to be malicious, assaultive, and polarizing. These behaviors drive people apart and can turn a disagreement into something that becomes harmful. We can choose to build relationships, foster unity, and create partnerships. These behaviors help people better understand each other, be more respectful, and can turn a disagreement into something that becomes beneficial. We can accomplish a lot if we work together. Be kind, be smart, and be safe.

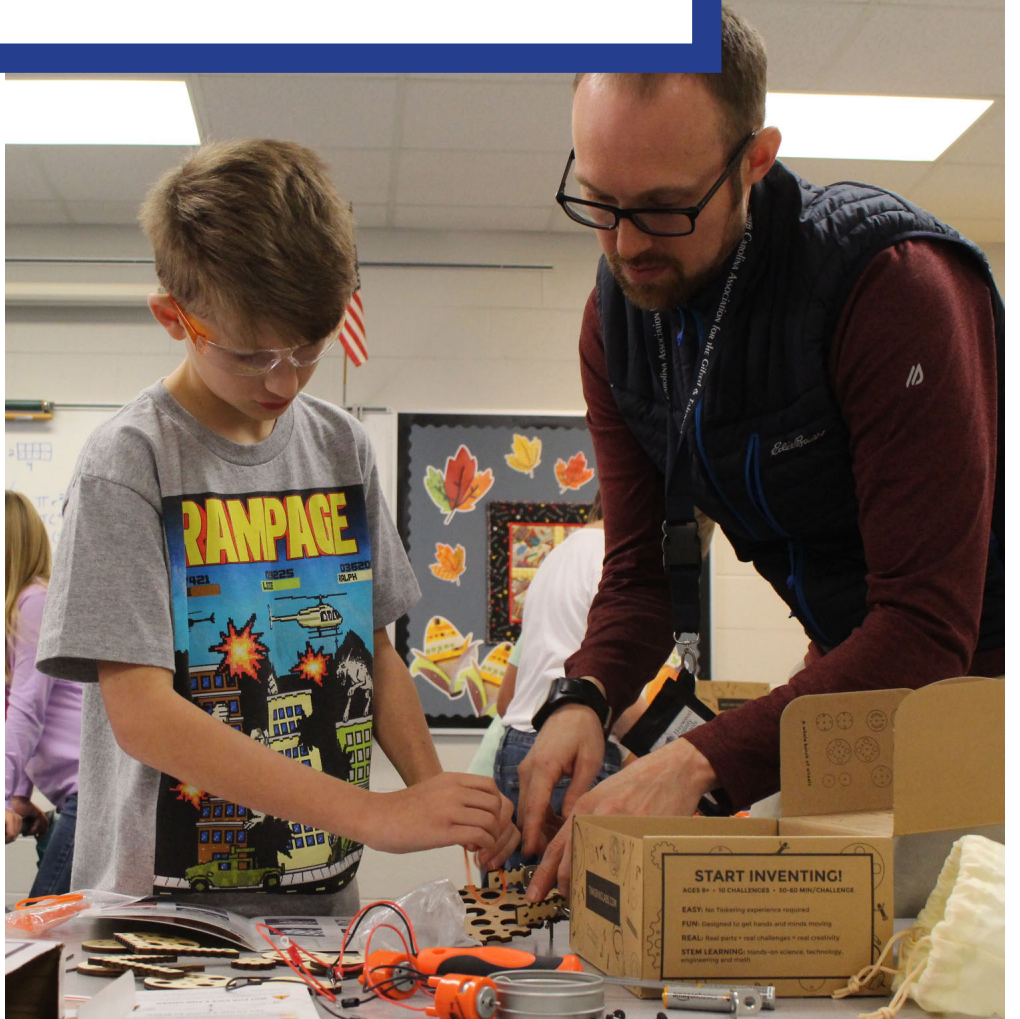

TODD BARBEE PRINCIPAL OF THE YEAR

I am so honored and humbled to be chosen by my colleagues as the Haywood County Schools Principal of the Year.

I have been lucky to work at all the school levels in Haywood County and had the opportunity to serve on both sides of our wonderful county. The one thing that I have realized from my prior experience, is it doesn't matter what your address is, White Oak, Canton, Hazelwood, Fines Creek, Iron Duff, Bethel, Waynesville, or Cruso, we have wonderful teachers, kids, and parents and guardians. Our teachers at all levels work diligently to make a positive impact with all their students.

Since March, I have witnessed teachers who had to switch to online education within three days and become masters of engaging students through virtual platforms. In addition to teaching, they were addressing the social and emotional needs of our students. Our teachers are ready to get back to the business of teaching kids, whether it is face-to-face, online, or some combination of those.

MORE THAN 700,000 MEALS SERVED

The COVID-19 pandemic has altered many things in Haywood County, but it has not changed our commitment to educating and caring for students.



Since the COVID-19 pandemic shut down schools in March, Haywood County Schools has served more than 770,000 meals to local children.

In a matter of days, the Haywood County Schools nutrition department transformed the county's schools into food distribution centers.

Every weekday for the past five months, many of the district's students and their parents have driven to schools across the county to pick up meals. Distributing breakfast and lunch while talking with children has been a highlight for cafeteria workers and teacher assistants since schools closed.

"Almost half of our students receive lunch through our free and reduced lunch program," Alison Francis, director of school nutrition, said. "We

knew it was critical to continue providing them meals, but we also wanted to extend our services to any child to help out families."

Francis said the district will continue providing meals through August 31 free of charge to any child under the age of 18. She anticipates changes may come after September 1, so be sure to check the Haywood County Schools' website for more information.

"These meals can extend a family's food budget during these uncertain economic times, and the meals are also comforting and familiar for students," Francis explained. "Many parents have said that they don't want to take away from someone that may need it more, but we have plenty of food on hand to feed anyone who wants it."

ADAPTING APPROACHES

In March, Haywood County Schools confronted the unprecedented challenge of school closure because of coronavirus head on. After dealing with the first priority, making sure students were safe and fed, our teachers figured out how to keep the learning alive. With no one-size-fits-all remedy, our teachers, principals, and faculty members found innovative ways to continue to help their students succeed academically and encourage emotional wellbeing.

With school now in session, Haywood County Schools is offering both remote learning and in-person learning for some at-risk student groups. Our goal for offering widespread in-person learning is September 21, with remote learning still being available to students who wish to remain at home.

PARTNERS IN EDUCATION

In May, the Haywood County Schools Foundation awarded 104 Pisgah, Tuscola, Haywood Early College, and Central Haywood high school seniors with 146 scholarships totaling \$246,750. Scholarship amounts ranged from \$500 to \$40,000.

Typically, students are surprised at school with the news, but this year students were notified via mail.

"This school year has been challenging and anything but ordinary for our students, so awarding these scholarships was a positive way to end their senior year," Jenny Wood, Haywood County Schools Foundation executive director, said. "A large portion of our scholarships come from endowed money, but several come from individuals and businesses in the community. We were so thankful that almost every single one of those made the commitment to still provide a scholarship despite the shaky economy we've experience recently."

Currently, the Foundation manages 77 scholarships. Scholarships may be endowed or funded annually. Criteria for awarding th scholarship are designed by the donors and the Foundation Board of Directors. Endowed scholarships are generated through the investment of permanently-held principals, so that only the income from the principal is used for scholarship awards.

We are continuing to grow assets to provide even more assistance to our school system and its students.



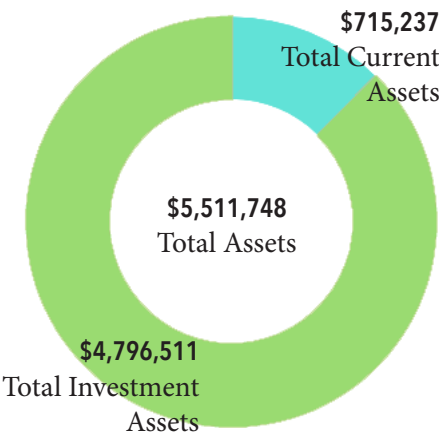
MARDI GRAS BALL

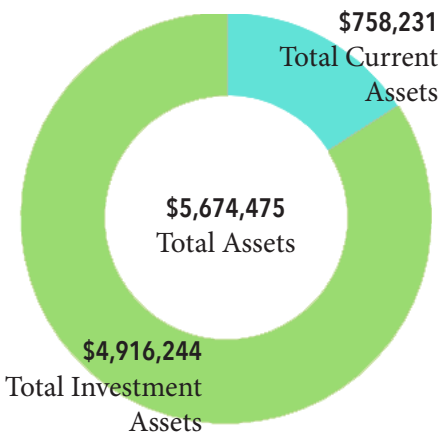
BINGO

GRANTS

Last fall, the Haywood County Schools Foundation gave 213 grants to teachers totaling \$43,992.

Grants were sponsored by Evergreen Packaging, First Citizens Banks, QuickDraw, the Arc of Haywood County, and the Haywood County Schools Foundation. The grants fund resources for teachers and staff to enrich the learning experience for students.

Teachers and staff from across the district applied for the grants, and winners were selected after committees representing each grant reviewed applications.

“We are so happy to be able to partner with area organizations each year to fund these innovative projects,” Haywood County Schools Foundation Executive Director Jenny Wood said. “Each of these grants that the teachers have created are investing in our students and getting them excited about learning.”

Grants were used to purchase everything from knitting looms for Pisgah’s art class to electricity-conducting paint for the county’s AIG students.

“Giving these grants to our local teachers is a way for us to live out our mission to provide better lives for our community members,” Kevin Wells, First Citizens Bank senior vice president, said. “Reading is the foundation to education, and it opens the world up to children.”

Each grant sponsor has different requirements and focuses of study. The Evergreen Packaging grant focuses on projects that promote math and science. The First

Citizens Bank grant provides funding to schools and teachers for reading initiatives. The QuickDraw art grant provides funds for art teachers to purchase materials for art education projects. The Arc of Haywood County grant is for teachers who work with Exceptional Children (EC) in the county.

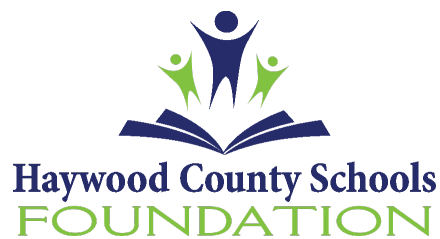
